IETF College Scholarship Fund

The IETF College Scholarship Program was launched Fall 2011 with a modest amount of funding. Since then, thirteen deserving students have been selected and presented with \$500 scholarships, to help lessen the financial burden of obtaining higher education.

The IETF is committed to awarding at least four scholarships each semester to exemplary students of all ages; to support them on their journey of learning and discovery.

Your donation is needed to continue to build the scholarship fund and help more students who are affected by essential tremor reach their full potential.

## Building the Scholarship Program

With your contribution to the scholarship fund, we can help qualified and deserving students finance some of their educational expenses, like books, housing costs, or student fees -- which can be substantial. Scholarship awards are paid directly to the student's licensed, accredited institution of higher learning.

For those who donate a minimum of \$500, the IETF will establish a specific scholarship award in your name to be awarded annually, i.e. the Jane Smith Award. Or you can choose to honor or memorialize a loved one by naming the award after them--a truly powerful tribute.

4. IETF scholarship committee selects awardees and presents awards
5. Funds are sent to student's institution of higher learning

7. Donor is notified of the scholarship award and who received it
